The **Rev. Dr. Daniel Hansen** "Dan" Hansen is an ordained United Church of Canada minister, as well as a church musician, spiritual director, and writer. Since teenage years, Dr. Hansen has served as a church musician in various denominations in southern Ontario and the eastern United States. Since his ordination and settlement in Manitoba and Northwestern Ontario Conference (1997), he has served in Maritime, Bay of Quinte, and the Montreal & Ottawa conferences.



A member of the original steering committee of The United Church of Canada Association of Musicians (UCCAM, recently renamed Music United), Dr. Hansen was the major writer and compiler of a booklet for the national United Church entitled *The Ministry of Music in the United Church of Canada: Guidelines for Musicians, Congregations, and Worship and M&P Committees* (2004). He is a significant player in an ongoing movement in the UCC encouraging musicians, clergy and churches to move into an understanding and practice of music as ministry. Dan believes that music and musicians are an integral aspect of churches seeking spiritual renewal, and that such growth must be grounded in God through theology and faith.

Joan Henry is the Montreal and Ottawa representative for Music United, the network for musicians within the United Church of Canada. Joan is a life-long member of the United Church, and has always had a keen interest in church music and how it can enhance the service and the spirit. Joan began working with Music United in May 2009.



Paul Sales is active in many aspects of the life of The United Church of Canada. He is a special gifts officer of the church for this region. Paul's leadership in the area of music ministry includes time as a director of music in a congregation; music editor for *Gathering—The United Church of Canada* worship resource; providing music leadership at conferences across the church. He has been involved with both UCCAM (United Church of Canada Association of Musicians) and its current manifestation as Music United.
